2016 & 2017 Cherry Fields Dolcetto

Wine Advocate’s Notes:

2016 Cherry Fields Dolcetto, from Polish Hill subregion of Clare, features black cherries, plums and faint cocoa notes. It’s the biggest of the Unico Zelo wines at 13.8% alcohol, making it medium to full-bodied. The tannins are supple, giving the palate a velvety feel, while hints of bitter almond emerge on the finish.

Remarkably consistent with the 2016 version, the 2017 version does seem a bit smoother and silkier, with brighter, bolder fruit and a crisp edge to the finish. Both are fun, juicy wines to enjoy in their youth.

Wine Advocate’s Note:

This fruit-driven wine is best consumed in the next year or so. Lime, guava, pineapple and melon notes all come together on the nose and palate. It’s medium to full-bodied and plump, with a slightly creamy texture. While relatively low in acidity, it’s easy-drinking a flavorful.



2017 Truffle Hound Barbera-Neibbilo

A 70-30 blend, this wine starts off bright, cherry-scented and floral. It’s light to medium-bodied, with tart, fresh, zippy fruit and herbal/savory undertones. The tannins are hardly noticeable, making this another candidate for early drinking.

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
